### Australian College of Critical Care Nurses (ACCCN)

### What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months?

### Publication of:

"Critical Care Pandemic Staffing Framework in Australia"

(Marshall, A. P., et.al., 2021, "Critical care pandemic staffing framework in australia", *Australian Critical Care*, 34, pp. 121-131)

This document is a result of multidiscipinary collaboration representing nursing, allied health, and medical disciplines, has used a modified consensus approach to provide recommendations to inform multidisciplinary workforce capacity expansion planning in critical care.

The Australian College of Critical Care Nurses journal "Australian Critical Care" continues to score extremely well in local and international metrics. The journal ranks the highest of Australian Nursing journals and internationally.

Convening of face to face "Annual Education Meeting" in Canberra. The first National face to face meeting held by ACCCN since the COVID-19 pandemic. The meeting was a huge success with the Chief Nurse of Australia, Alison MacMillan opening the event.

There is also push in NSW to incorporate the Australian College of Critical Care Nursing Workforce Standards into the Nursing Award. Other States within Australia have been successful in incorporate these standards into their awards. The ACCCN Workforce Standards represent an evidence based, best practice approach outlining the fundamental registered nurse staffing levels to deliver a safe and effective level of nursing care to the critical ill adult in an Australian Intensive Care Unit. ACCCN is also working on a collaborative approach to workforce issues with other intensive care disciplines.

ACCCN has recently setup a Global Health Advisory Panel (GHAP). The GHAP is a nursing lead group to build capacity, skill, expertise and experience to advise, support and lead healthcare developments abroad, especially in the low and middle income Countries in our region. To date the activities of the GHAP have been focused on providing support to Critical Care Nurses in Papua New Guinea. ACCCN has recently sent a small delegation to visit Critical Care centres in Papua New Guinea and held a number of webinars and education meetings.

During the planning for COVID-19 it became obvious that there are no reliable Australian databases to accurately determine the number of specialised nursing positions currently working in a clinical area. This became apparent in trying to ascertain the numbers of Intensive Care Nurses available in the event of a pandemic. This type of information is vital for future pandemic planning. Perhaps questions relating to nursing specialisation could be included into the annual APHRA Nurses Survey for key areas such as intensive care and aged care nursing

Name of organisation: Australian College of Neonatal Nurses

### What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months?

ACNN continues to maintain a steady membership base of over 900, including a few students. We have moved to offering membership renewal rates for up to 5 years and this has been taken up by a proportion of members. The NSW and Queensland Branches have conducted membership drives in their states, and a national membership drive took place during May.

Unfortunately the Victorian Branch was unable to maintain an operating committee and has disbanded. All members in Victoria retain the same membership benefits as for those in states and territories that do not have branch committees.

Meetings for Branches, Special Interest Groups and the Executive continue via Zoom where COVID-19 restrictions do not allow face to face meetings.

The established special interest groups are active, except for the Low Resource Countries SIG, which may no longer continue its activities in Papua New Guinea during the pandemic. However, they are working on other activities such as educational tools. Some of the SIGs have hosted Zoom seminars with presentations focussing on their area of interest and these have proved popular with members.

The new SIGs for neonatal skin and for infant feeding are in their first year of operation and will be reviewed by the Executive at the end of that period. Both these new groups are being supported by members.

Scholarships and awards continue to be available for members. Assessment times have been adjusted to be more applicable to the types of applications, for example those that relate to enrolment in education programs.

The social media committee is active on accounts for Facebook, and Twitter. This activity is increasingly important for raising the profile of ACNN.

ACNN is planning to hold the annual conference that had been deferred from last year, in Canberra 8 to 10 September 2021. The preliminary program is available featuring speakers confirmed at this point. Free abstract submission closed on 30 April with 37 submissions, a record number and the full program will be confirmed soon. Registration is now open.

### **CoNNMO Member Meeting Report: January-June 2021**

Name of organisation: Australian College of Nursing (ACN)

What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months? Meeting with Minister Hunt, Minister for Health & Aged Care, to discuss the role of Nurse Practitioners in Australia's health system.



The Minister recognised the important role that Nurse Practitioner's currently play in primary care, as well as how they can further support patient care in key areas of need, including aged care, mental health and in rural and regional areas. Following the coalition or nursing organisations discussion, it was agreed to work with the Minister and the Department of Health to develop a 10-year plan for Nurse Practitioner-led models of care. A working group will be established with key stakeholders from the nursing and medical sector to help inform and develop this plan.

### Policy Summit

Nurse leaders from across Australia and the world came together for ACN's Policy Summit held in Canberra on March 19 in a mixed face-to-face and virtual format. Members of ACN's Policy Chapters, Working Groups, nurses and other health professionals identified and discussed major policy opportunities and strategies. A high-profile panel discussion was also featured with ACT Health Minister Rachel Stephen-Smith MLA, Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officer Adjunct Professor Alison McMillan MACN, former Secretary Australian Government Department of Ms Glenys Beauchamp PSM and Mr Howard Catton Chief Executive Officer, International Council of Nurses who joined from Geneva. Several policy documents were launched including:

- The role of nurses in support older people to access, quality safe aged care Position Statement
- Optimising person- and family-centred end of life care during a pandemic Position Statement
- Voluntary Assisted Dying Position Statement
- The role of the nurse in assessment and management of multimorbidity Position Statement
- A national minimum dataset for nursing workforce planning and Decision-Making White Paper
- ACN Emissions Reduction Charter
- Men in Nursing Guiding Principles
- Diversity and Inclusion Guiding Principles
- Value-based health care through Nursing Leadership

### Policy Fellows Program

Supported by the ACN Philanthropic Foundation, in February 2021, seven ACN Policy Fellows commenced an educational program and active involvement in ACN's Policy and Advocacy agenda with the aim of developing nursing leaders who will have the knowledge and skills to go on to positively influence health policy and Australia's health care system. This is the second year the program has been offered; it has received positive feedback from current and former Fellows.

#### **Education Programs and Scholarships**

ACN supported graduate certificates programs to Pacific Islander students in critical care, perioperative nursing and immunisation. ACN also partnered with the Australian Government to develop and deliver free and accredited training modules for COVID-19 vaccination providers including health care professional in hospital, general practices, state and Commonwealth vaccination clinics, Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations and pharmacies. In celebration of International Nurses Day, during the month of May 2021 ACN offered 1,000 scholarships for the ACN's Transition to Practice Program to ACN members and a 50% discount to non-members. This program prepares newly qualified Registered and Enrolled Nurses for a confident entry into the workforce.

#### The ACN Nursing & Health Virtual Expo

This <u>expo</u> held on 24 April 2021 provides the opportunity for nurses to discover and progress their career in the nursing and health professions. It has a strong reputation for connecting visitors with a range of organisations including hospitals, health care services, educational institutions and specialty nursing groups. There are a wealth of products and services on show and visitors gain practical take-home advice and skills in a series of complimentary educational seminars.

### Policy and advocacy initiatives to advance significant areas requiring nursing input

ACN has established a Nurses and Violence Task force with four subcommittees: i) Nurses Caring for People Experiencing Domestic Violence; ii) Nurses Experiencing Domestic Violence; iii) Occupational Violence; and iv) Nurses Caring for Children of Family and Domestic Violence. These Committees will build on existing work such as the Position Statement's <u>Bullying in the Workplace</u> (2021) and coercive control (to be released soon) In addition, the Aged Care Solutions Expert Advisory Group (EAG) was established to proactively lead the nursing response to the recommendations contained in the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety, Final Report tabled on 1 March 2021.

### When is your national conference? (Please include the details)

The National Nursing Forum (NNF) is ACN's signature annual leadership and educational event bringing together nurses, students and other health professionals from around the country and across the globe. The NNF will take place from Wednesday 18 – Friday 20 August 2021 at the National Convention Centre in Canberra. The theme for the NNF is 'Champions of Change' which will be explored in the keynote plenary sessions and throughout the program.

#### Are there any issues that CoNNMO members may be able to assist your organisation with?

Consistent with the Aged Care Solution EAG's goals, ACN would welcome support from other organisations in developing a whole of profession co-ordinated response to the many issues effecting the nursing profession as raised in the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety, Final Report. For example, establishing priorities essential to sustainable, effective, and rights-based aged care reform and nurse-led means of achieving those reforms.

ACN would also welcome input from CoNNMO memebrs in relation to ACN's Nurses and Violence agenda, for example, to develop co-ordinated strategies to remove bullying in the workforce, especially nurse to nurse bullying.

### Are there any particular topics you wish CoNNMO to consider or present at member meetings?

Yes, as noted above, develop a co-ordinated response to the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety, Final Report how to expand the nursing workforce (co-ordinate with Deans of Nursing) and proactively leading the drafting of a new rights based aged care act.

In addition to the above, ACN suggests that CoNNMO consider inclusion of the following: nursing specific issues associated with the 'vaccination rollout'; a regulated third tier workforce in aged care; and emissions reduction through nursing leadership.



### Australian College Of Perioperative Nurses (ACORN)

### What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months?

The ACORN Roadmap Project (RMP) continues to progress under the governance of the National Leadership Group (NLG). COVID-19 delayed progress; however, the combined efforts of ACORN member volunteers and academic, clinical and professional perioperative and health care sector leaders have enabled the RMP to gain momentum. The RMP timeline has been extended with ACORN expecting a final NLG RMP report including findings and recommendations by November 2021.

### **Update June 2021**

During May, the Roadmap Project (RMP) has flourished, and the project is on course to finish on schedule with the RMP's National Leadership Group's (NLG) final meeting on 15 September 2021. We appreciate that the RMP's work, undertaken from 2019 to 2021, has significantly underpinned the improvements in the ACORN Standards.

The Professional Workstream Team (WST) and the NLG have carefully considered the comments and suggestions collected from ACORN members' during the online feedback process for the Professional Practice Standards for Perioperative Nurses (PPSPN) – Registered Nurse. The RMP report in May detailed how the <a href="mailto:online-feedback-process">online-feedback-process</a> offers ACORN members unique pre-publication insights into the recommendations of expert advisors and enables members to understand how ACORN advocates for perioperative nurses.

More than 30 ACORN members submitted feedback about the draft PPSPN – Registered Nurse. Overwhelmingly the feedback was positive. Several feedback items expressed gratitude for the preview and for ACORN's ongoing work to support and advocate for Australian perioperative nurses. Some of those 30 members suggested specific concepts, tools and value-adds that they believe can assist them with local implementation of this and other PPSPNs. ACORN is delighted to advise that it is currently considering the options for a suite of practical tools and resources that align with and complement the 2022 ACORN Standards.

### Cancer Nurses Society of Australia

### What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months?

Over the past six months, our main focus has been:

- **Membership renewals:** with our membership year running from 1 April 31 March, our renewal period opened in mid February. Our renewal rate is currently at 81.7% with a goal of 85% by 30 June.
- **Development of Organisational membership:** after discussions with a large employer of cancer nurses, the development of a pilot organisational membership was implemented. This resulted in the addition of 155 members to CNSA.
- Workforce project: CNSA has identified that there is no real data on the cancer nursing workforce, and
  has commenced a research project to collate data and understand trends. A main piece of work to ensure
  this project was successful was having cancer care recognised by AHPRA as a speciality area to allow us
  to mine the data. This piece of advocacy work was successful in December 2020 (with thanks to some
  introductions from CoNNMO)
- **Congress:** After the outbreaks over Christmas and snap lockdowns in Brisbane and Perth, it was decided that we would hold CNSA Congress across five locations to minimise risk. This move has been successful, with 450 delegates registered for this event nationally.
- **Education:** We have continued running regular webinars for members, with ten run so far in 2021. We have also reintroduced F2F education in Perth and Adelaide

### When is your national conference? (Please include the details)

CNSA's 23rd Annual Congress will be going ahead as a face to face event in 2021. The Congress will be held on Friday 18th June in Adelaide, Brisbane, Melbourne, Sydney and Perth.

The theme is reflective of the year that has been - with Cancer Nurses called on to rise to the unique challenges the healthcare sector faced as a result of COVID-19. A Voice to Be Heard: Driving Cancer Care and System Reform is a powerful message and emphasises the role our members, and the wider nursing workforce, have played during the pandemic.

# Professional Association of Nurses in Developmental Disability Australia (PANDDA)

### What have been the significant activities of your organisation in the last six months?

- A revised version of the PANDDA Standards were launched in November 2020 and replace the original PANDDA Standards from 2002. The Standards are based directly on the research evidence that PANDDA has been supporting through a range of strategies.
- PANDDA provided witness statements to Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, neglect and Exploitation
  of People with Disability Health care for people with cognitive disability and appeared at the commission
  to give expert evidence. The outcome of the Royal Commission is due for release in the near future.
  PANNDA expects that the health needs of people with intellectual and developmental disability will be at
  the forefront of some recommendations and that the role that nurses do, and can play, will also be among
  the recommendations.
- PANDDA held a face-to-face Conference in November 2020 which was also live streamed due to COVID
  uncertainty. Speakers included Adjunct Professor Kylie Ward, Australian College of Nursing: Professor
  Owen Barr, Ulster University, Londonderry, Northern Ireland and Assistant Professor Melissa Desroches,
  University of Massachusetts, Dartmout.
- PANDDA has attended the National Roundtable on the Health of People with Intellectual Disability since August 2019. This Roundtable negotiated via leadership from advocates and leading researchers secured a commitment from Hon. Greg Hunt, MP prior to the last Federal election to hold a series of Roundtables about health and intellectual disability. In April 2020 the Department of Health sent out a questionnaire to further develop the Roadmap. PANDDA responded by stating that many of the proposed initiatives were very medically focussed and sought to remind everyone involved in the Roundtable that nurses represent the largest part of the health workforce. PANDDA is advocating for positive changes, such as the mandating of Undergraduate Curricula with a focus on 'Health and people with intellectual and developmental disability'.
- PANDDA is continuing to provide regular CPD webinars at a small cost to non-members.
- PANDDA were successful in their submission to a review of the Ageing and Disability Commissioner Act 2019 to have nurses included as a health professional who can support the execution of search warrants in cases of neglect or abuse of vulnerable adults living in care settings.
- PANDDA President delivered a presentation to the Council of Deans for Nursing and Midwifery on the 25<sup>th</sup>
  March, 2021 about the work that PANDDA has been undertaking as well as to foreground the issues around
  the possible future mandating of content about intellectual disability in the undergraduate nursing
  curriculum.
- PANDDA remains an active partner in the NDIS funded "Every Nurses Business" national project.
