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






Domains and capability levels

Action plan



Develop Action plan for the implementation of the Framework with a recommendation on relevant resources that align with each of the framework domains

Consult with nursing & midwifery cohort (working across settings) and seek feedback on self-assessment tool and resources

Stakeholder consultations

- **Purpose:** General awareness of framework, usability of the self-assessment tool and what resources will benefit
- **Diverse engagement:** Nursing & midwifery representatives working across settings participated (including those working in SA Health, participating in APNA nurse champion and Emerald).

Key themes:

- Majority were unaware of the Framework, however they thought it would be useful.
- Implementation should be a 'top-down approach'
- Access to practical resources to support implementation

Domain 1 – Digital Professionalism

Professional standards are maintained in the digital environment: Nurses and midwives demonstrate attitudes and behaviours reflecting recognised professional standards when utilising digital tools both professionally and personally.
