Opt-Out

- By the end of 2018, every Australian will have a My Health Record, unless they choose not to;
- The My Health Record Communications Team is providing information packs to PHNs & Jurisdictions during 2018
- Information packs will detail what the Opt-out process is, how it will affect providers and consumers, and information on the benefits of the My Health Record;
- The Agency is working with the community to provide further information on the My Health Record.

The Provider Readiness stream's main objective is to have healthcare providers;

- aware of My Health Record
- be able to discuss with a consumer what the benefits of My Health Record are
- know where to seek further information about My Health Record if required.


This is achieved through a multi-layered, multi-channel, complex tailored change and adoption program based on the 3- tiered approach consisting of Awareness, Enablement and Participation that aims to achieve meaningful clinical use.





Provider Readiness Change & Adoption Model


- Change and adoption model leveraging key delivery partners forms the basis for the implementation of the Provider Readiness Stream.

Leveraging a national approach, each State and Territory health department and the majority of private hospitals are engaged to provide awareness and education to clinicians and front line staff in readiness for the opt out

Clinical front line staff awareness campaigns commencing in public hospitals and Private Hospitals prior to the commencement of Opt Out

Clinical Peak Bodies


The Agency, through formal relationships with the clinical peak bodies, will deliver strategic communications on the My Health Record utilising established channels.

Priority Content – Uploading to My Health Record – 2018 Projections








State/Territory Readiness Comparison

All Jurisdictions have commenced awareness activities in preparation for opt out


Targeted Scope includes front line staff, ED clinicians, nursing staff and HIMs

Approach to engagement with Nursing Organisations

- Strategic approach underway
- Building on past projects and existing relationships, strategy aligns with Agency Provider Readiness
 Program and broader needs of the Agency
- Approach is tiered to provide tailored support
- Initial target organisations:
 - Coalition of National Nursing & Midwifery Organisations (CoNNMO)
 - Australian College of Nursing (ACN)
 - Australian Primary Healthcare Nurses Association (APNA)
 - Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation (ANMF)
 - Australian College of Nurse Practitioners (ACNP)





Approach to engagement with Nursing Organisations

- Endorsed collateral with profession-specific content (toolkits) developed collaboratively.
- o Collaboration between Agency and organisations to tailor content of toolkits to meet member needs.
- o Identification and engagement of clinical champions from within membership to support the peer to peer messaging and education of nurses nationally. These champions will sit within a broader pool of clinical champions, including already inducted nurses.
- Opportunity for organisational representatives to join 'Listening Forums'.
- Working within a boarder group of nurses, there is opportunity for the use of the nursing workforce, crossing multiple organisations, specialities and practice settings.
