Informatics

- Informatics scientific discipline that employs information technology to deal with the capture, storage, retrieval, communication and optimal use of data, information, and knowledge (Sewell & Thede 2013)
- ► Health Informatics evolved from medical informatics, and is the science and practice around information in health that leads to informed and assisted healthcare (HISA 2012)
- Nursing Informatics the specialty that integrates nursing science with multiple information and analytical sciences to identify, define, manage, and communicate data, information, knowledge, and wisdom in nursing practice (Nursing Informatics Position Statement 2017)



Why Nursing Informatics

- Healthcare in most countries are currently undertaking digitisation
- Nurses as knowledge workers versus Nurses as informaticians
- Nurses need to be:
 - digitally proficient, data enabled and innovation aware
 - at the table when decisions are being made about technology
 - part of system configuration and implementation
 - given the freedom to be innovative to improve efficiency and effectiveness
 - encouraged to pursue data analysis opportunities
 - aware of the benefits that digitisation brings to nursing
